







4. Ensure the course is offered the semester you are applying to. If the tab is inactive, the course is not offered.

At Stockholm University you need to take 30 credits per semester in order to study full-time. Our courses are 7.5, 15 or 30 credits with a few exceptions. This means you can, for example, select one 30 credit course, two 15 credits courses, four 7.5 credit courses or one 15 and two 7.5 credit courses during a semester.

When you look in the course database you have to be aware that the semester is divided into two parts, period 1 and 2. Check which period the course is starting. If you for example select two 15 credit courses (offered at pace percentage “100%”) you must make sure they are not both starting the same period. If this is the case the workload will be too heavy that period with nothing to study the other.

Most courses are offered at pace percentage “100%”, meaning that a 15 credit course will be completed during one period. There are also courses offered at pace percentage “50%” or “25%”. A 15 credit course with pace percentage “50%” will be completed after two periods and so on.
